### Emergency Medicine Pathway

### Timeline:

- February: Sign up for EM interest at UCD Residency Fair. We will have an advising meeting in late Feb introducing you to the EM pathway. Consider applying to an away rotation.
- March: 4<sup>th</sup> year schedule into EFlight. It is recommended to take EMR440 in blocks 1-2.
- April: Apply for 1 away rotation through VSAS. We recommend 1 away, 2 if you would like. These are in addition to your EMR440 Acting Internship
- May-August: EMR440, USMLE II, 1 away EM Acting Internship
- September: ERAS application and UCD EM Mock Interview practice
- October-January: Interviews
- February: Rank list due
- March: MATCH!!!



## Standardized Letter of Evaluation (SLOE)

The SLOE is Emergency Medicine's
Letter of Recommendation. It is
important that you get a SLOE from all
the EM clerkships you do (recommended
at least 1 away rotation + UCD
EMR440). Dr. Russell Jones will write
you a SLOE for the EMR440 clerkship
based on a consensus of evaluations from
the UCD faculty. You will need 1 more
traditional LOR from another source.

## Final Thoughts

Emergency Medicine residency is a competitive specialty. UC Davis has had a rich tradition of matching students into EM and it is annually in the top 5 specialty choices of our students.
